Reclaim under the Soldiers Treaty:

It is with regret due to lack of communication and breach of duty, that we will now need to compile another file, which will require an extension of a further few months.

Janet Mason has not returned all of our historic documents. By this lack of action, she has not only compromised the timing of this appeal, but deceived us under false pretenses and let down all fallen ones of The Great War.

This is a serious breach of duty by Janet Mason, and we have sent correspondence regarding it to the Serious Fraud Office and the Law Commissioner. You should have also received a copy sent to Legal Aid last week. We will need to await the outcome from Serious Fraud Office and the Law Commissioner before we are in a position to move forward.

Michael Doogan was Janet Mason's lead provider, and as such, the case was handed over to him.

Since 2011 Mr Doogan was reviewing our files, but failed to submit documents that were specifically sent by us to keep my lawyer up to date on our findings. These findings represented seven years of research by myself and my researcher.

Mr Doogan and Janet Mason have obtained and concealed a large number of our documents.

It is interesting to note that at that time Mr Doogan was in the process of being appointed Judge for the Maori Land Court, on the 12/12/2012 after viewing our documents.

I have read the file from Legal Aid, and found that they have not been in receipt of further documentation. These documents would prove beyond doubt that this claim has genuine merit, and every chance of a successful outcome.

This requires immediate and thorough investigation.
