Thank you for the reply, but you seem to have missed out other important points from the original requests. This was concerning the legal team from the Defence Department researching and supporting Maori Military Veterans for the Treaty of Waitangi. The Treaty of Waitangi was not created for Maori Military Veterans. In September 1916 when the draft was put into place, this was for non Maori only. The link that you sent us is incorrect. You must get hold of the Culture and Heritage Military Historian, she will help you to explain how the draft was created for W.W.1 Expeditionary Forces. I have attached an audio and the overview for you, so you will hear first hand that Treason has been raised in Parliament, this has now been covered up with the assistance from the Ministry of Justice.
