Dear Andrew,

On the 6/9/2016 I presented our petition which was tabled in Parliament.

On the 3/11/2016, I read the overview of the Petition presented in front of the Primary Production Select Committee, to redress an illegal bankruptcy.

I have attached a file, which reads, "Petition to Parliament." It has been presented as evidence. Another was presented verbally to the Select Committee, with the overview of the Petition. We broke down nine years of research into 20 pages, as was required by the Select Committee. We found this to be an impossible task. However, we submitted 53 pages; just enough for those reading it to grasp an understanding of its' complex content.

Here's an example of one of the many treasonous acts that took place, which is called "lese majesty". I have attached a further three documents which I had not been presented within the 53. The Minister of Lands, W. Fraser, J.S. Dickson MP and the Commissioner of State Forest, R. H. Rhodes, along with a prominent Timber Merchant, were involved with sections of Soldiers Holdings. (Section 3-5-6, Block 5. Ongarue Survey District.) This does not exist in the NZ Gazette. Actually they are referring to Soldiers Holdings. (Sections 1- 2- and 3 Block 5 Hurakia Survey District.)

Section 2 is my Grandparents Block, and belongs to my father today. Many other supporting documents support other treasonous activities against my family along with a large number of Returned Servicemen and the King. Our Soldiers came home to a political war, undermined by greed. These are ACTS OF TREASON.

Under Section 73 of The Criminal Act of 1961, the death penalty was replaced by a prison sentence.

On December 26, 1989, Helen Clark abolished the death penalty for treason.

WHY?

It appears that Government committed treason. They then changed the legislation regarding treason, in order to cover up their own past treasonous activities.

A copy of this petition, regarding redress, was presented by the Select Committee to the Ministry of Justice. We would appreciate a copy of this, and any other relevant material.

We would also like to know the members of the team, and the team leader, who will be addressing this enquiry. We have had a lot of dealings with Government Departments over many years with regard to our claim. You will have viewed the paperwork leading into our petition. This has not been addressed. Ministers will not release their reports under the Official Information Act.
